Connect & Review

1. How would you define “The Good Life?”
2. What do you know about the book of Titus? Why is it worth studying together as a church the next 7 weeks?

Investigate & Dig

3. **Read the entire book of Titus.** What stands out to you? What questions do you have? How would you describe the tone of this letter? What would you say is the main theme?
4. **Read Titus 1:1-4 again.** How does this introduction differ from some of Paul’s other letters? How is it similar?
5. How does Paul describe himself (his identity)? How does he describe his calling? What do we learn about his relationships?

Apply & Respond

6. What are some of the lies you believe about your identity? What does it mean to be given a “new identity in Christ” (cf. **2 Corinthians 5:17**)? What part of your new identity is most meaningful to you (you may want to read **Ephesians 1:1-2:10**)?
7. How has God called us to live as His people? How has He called you specifically to serve Him & others (i.e. what gifts, passions, & life experiences has He given you?)
8. Who are you doing life together with? What are the joys & challenges of this? How can this be a marker that distinguishes the church from the world around us?
9. Do you agree with Paul’s assessment that “the good life” is living out your identity & calling together with others? Why or why not?
10. What do you sense God wants you to do as a result of this message? How can the group encourage you in this?
