- 4. Read Prov. 13:3, 21:23; Eph. 4:29; Col. 4:6; James 1:19-20. How could we practice being careful with our words as it relates to politics?
- 5. Read John 17. Give different people an opportunity to read sections of this chapter. What stands out to you as you hear God's Word read aloud?
- 6. How do we fight for unity in such a politically divisive culture? Is there anything you have found helpful?
