Spiritual Gifts

Administration: special ability to plan and execute procedures. (1 Cor. 12:28)

Apostleship: innovators who plant new churches or ministries. (1 Cor. 12:28-29; Eph. 4:11-12; Rom. 1:5)

Discernment: being able to distinguish truth/error in a situation. (1 Cor. 12:10)

Encouragement: strengthen, comfort those who are discouraged. (Rom. 12:8)

Evangelism: communicate the gospel in a way that people respond in faith. (Eph. 4:11)

Faith: trusting God to fulfill His plan and to act on His promises. (1 Cor. 12:9; Rom. 4:18-21)

Giving: give freely and with joy to further His kingdom. (Rom. 12:8; 1 Cor. 6:8)

Healing: the divine enablement to be God's means for restoring people to wholeness. (1 Cor. 12:9, 28, 30)

Helps/Serving: helping those in need with practical assistance (Romans 12:7; 1 Cor. 12:28)

Hospitality: Making people feel welcome, appreciated, and wanted (Rom. 12:13; 1 Peter 4:9)

Knowledge: The ability to learn, know and explain God's Word. (1 Cor. 12:8)

Leadership: cast vision, motivate and direct people to accomplish the purposes of God. (Romans 12:8)

Mercy: The person with this gift shows acts of compassion to those who are suffering or in need. (Rom. 12:8)

Miracles: the divine ability to authenticate the ministry and message of God through supernatural interventions which glorify Him. (1 Cor. 12:10)

Prophecy: proclaiming the Word of God with boldness (Romans 12:6; 1 Cor. 12:10)

Shepherding: to nurture, care for and guide people toward spiritual maturity. (Eph. 4:11-12; 1 Peter 5:1-4)

Teaching: understand, clearly explain and apply the Word of God in the lives of listeners. (Rom. 12:7; 1 Cor. 12:28-29)

Tongues and Interpretation: receive a message from God and speak it in an unknown language that is then made known to the church through the gift of interpretation. (1 Cor. 12:10)

Wisdom: the ability to discern works of the Holy Spirit and apply it to teaching and actions. (1 Cor. 12:8)
